ORDER

The complaint of the petitioner is that a retail out let of the Bharath

Petrolium Corporation is put up near the house of the petitioner and the toilet

constructed in the parking area of the retail out let which was not covered

preventing her sight on it. In spite of her complaint to the Secretary,

Kudappanakunnu Grama Panchayat no action has taken.

A report was called for from the Secretary, Kudappanakunnu Grama

Panchayat. In the report the Secretary of the Panchayat has stated that one Reetha

Wilson put up a retail out let of the Bharath Petroleum Corporation after obtaining

consent from the Panchayat in No.419/07-08 dated 29..2..08. The consent was

issued to the said out let after obtaining No Objection Certificate from the

Pollution Control Board, Fire Force Department, Additional District Magistrate

and the Chief Town Planner, Thiruvananthapuram. It is also stated in the report

that the petitioner filed a complaint before the Panchayat on 26..4..2010 regarding

the parking area of the retail out let is constructed close to her house and the

Panchayat heard the parties on 4..5..2010. In the hearing the petitioner

complained about the toilet constructed in the parking area should be covered

preventing the sight from her house and the parking area should not be used for

other purposes. The Manager represented the retail outlet agreed the suggestion of

the petitioner.

In view of the above report of the Secretary of the Panchayat no orders are

required from this Commission except to say that the Grama Panchayat will take

appropriate steps to see that the petitioner is not to put up any difficulty on account

of any pollution from any source. The Environmental Engineer, Pollution Control

Board, will also inspect the spot in question and take appropriate steps to solve

the problem, if any, of the petitioner after hearing all the parties concerned.

The petition is closed with the above direction.
