## ORDER

The above complaint was filed by the petitioner on the allegation that R1 and R2 have damaged the household articles and removed gold ornaments and cash and that R3 did not take any action in spite of the complaint given by the petitioner.

In the report submitted by the Superintendent of Police (Rural), Thiruvananthapuram, it is stated that there is a dispute between the petitioner and R1 in respect of vacating the premises belonging to R4 who is the daughter of R1.

According to the report, on the statement of R4 a crime was registered in crime

No.644/2007 and after investigation final report was filed before the Judicial First

Class Magistrate, Varkala and similarly a crime was registered in crime

No.30/2008 on the complaint of the petitioner that his house hold articles were

damaged by the respondents and thereafter final report was filed before the

Judicial First Class Magistrate, Varkala. According to the report, the petitioner

also filed a case before the Munsif Court, Varkala.

Along with the report statement of the petitioner is seen annexed in which

he has stated that since cases are pending no further action is required on his

petition.

On going through the report it is seen that the Varkala Police has registered

crime on the complaint of the petitioner and that cases are also pending before the

Courts. As the matter has become subjudice and also in view of the statement of

the petitioner no further orders are required on this petition.

The petition is accordingly closed.
