ORDER

Though notices were issued to the petitioners in both the HRMPS the petitioner in HRMP No.526/08 alone appeared. The above two HRMPs relate to the same matter and the following common order is passed.

The complaints in the petitions are that the Police demanded money and later Thulasi, the petitioner in HRMP 613/08 was detained at Neyyar Dam Police Station on 31.01.2008 and on 5.2.2008 the S.I. of Police, Neyyar Dam Police Station entered her house, abused and assaulted her.

In the report submitted by the Deputy Supdt. of Police, Nedumangad, it is stated that there is a dispute between the petitioner and the respondents who are the nephews of Pushparajan, petitioner in HRMP 526/08, and who is in a habit of giving complaints against his nephews. According to the report the petitioner Pushparajan's wife Ambika is no longer living with him as she is mentally sick and she is living with her parents and that Thulasi, sister-in-law of Pushparajan, with her child is staying with Pushparajan.

The petitioner reiterating the allegations submits that he has a medical certificate to show that he was beaten by the Police officials though he has not produced the same before me, and from the report nothing could be seen that the petitioner or his sister-in-law produced the medical certificate before the officer who conducted the enquiry in the above petition. In any event in view of the statement of the petitioner Pushparajan that he and Thulasi were beaten by the S.I. of Police, Neyyar Dam, an enquiry will be conducted by the Superintendent of Police (Rural) Thiruvananthapuram, if the petitioner files a petition before the Supdt. of Police (Rural) along with the medical certificates and then take to steps according to law.

With the above direction the HRMPs are closed.
