ORDER

The above HRMP was filed by the petitioner stating that "the petition is filed for the very necessity of contingency of getting permission to use the licensed pistol for my remaining life, and in supporting to seeking other consequential relief". Thereafter the petitioner in his petition had given details under the caption 'synopsis' which show that there were several legal proceedings before various courts including the High Court of Kerala.

The petitioner ultimately claimed several reliefs and one such relief is to grant him license to use pistol/revolver. The other reliefs sought by the petitioner are to initiate action against several individuals mentioned in the prayer and also seeking a sum of Rs.65,000/- as the ex-gratia of initial expenses of medication and allow him to realize the maturity value of money in Policy No.780594179 on

account of reasons mentioned in sub para (j) and also to direct Oachira and Karunagappaly Police to conduct proper investigation in crime No.386/08.

As this Commission has no jurisdiction to direct any authority to issue pistol/revolver and also other reliefs sought against individuals the HRMP was closed on 20-11-2008 the ground that the prayers do not fall within the purview of the Commission and Courts have also passed orders and this Commission has no jurisdiction over judicial verdicts.

After the above HRMP was closed a letter from the Chief Minister's Public Grievance Redressal Cell was received which indicates that the petitioner has sent a letter to the Chief Minister's Public Grievance Redressal Cell to consider his request in the above HRMP as early as possible.

In view of the above no further orders can be passed by this Commission.
The petition is closed.
