ORDER

The above HRMP was registered on the complaint that the construction of multi storied flats resulting in pollution and leads to scarcity of water and that direction should be given to the authorities concerned to see that multi storied flats do not cause any problem and that the number also should be limited and further to see that steps are taken to safeguard the hygiene in the locality. It is also stated in the petition that many plots in Golf Links Road near Paippinmood in Kawdiar ward and nearby places are purchased by the construction companies for the purpose of constructing flats and hence arrangements should be taken to control pollution in the area.

In the report submitted by the Secretary, Thiruvananthapuram Corporation it is stated that it is true that some properties have been purchased in the areas mentioned in the petition but so far no application was received for consent for the construction from any company and if any application is received in the matter it will be considered and consent will be issued only as per law.

It is therefore clear that the Corporation, Thiruvananthapuram has not received any application for construction activities and if any application is received it will be considered as per the provisions of law.

The petition is, therefore, to be closed with a direction to the authorities to see that while giving permission for construction of flats the authorities should keep in mind the nature of pollution which is likely to be caused in the area and availability of water for the people in the locality and such other factors and also to see that nobody is affected in the area by such construction.
