ORDER

The complaint of the petitioner is that at about 8.00 p.m on 23-1-2010 her neighbour Santha alias Ramani and her relatives assaulted her husband and took away his torch and thereafter they called the police. Though she filed a complaint before the Aryancode Police in the matter no action was taken.

In the report submitted by the Deputy Superintendent of Police, Neyyattinkara, it is stated that the petitioner's husband is a drunkard and a public nuisance and he was warned several times by the Police. According to the report, at about 8.00 p.m. on 23-1-2010 Jayaprakash, son of Santha, came to the Police Station and complained that the petitioner's husband Raju abused and tried to assault his parents. The Police officials went to the spot and they saw that Raju was creating problems in his own house in an intoxicated state and hence he was warned. In the report it is further stated that the petitioner filed a petition before Aryancode Police alleging assault on her husband by Santha and others and the

enquiry, on the said complaint, revealed that the allegation by the petitioner is false and hence no action was taken by the Police.

It is also stated in the report that an enquiry was conducted on this HRMP and it was revealed that the petitioner filed this HRMP only to prevent the Police action against her husband for causing nuisance after getting intoxicated and that the parties were warned not to cause any nuisance in the area and the Sub Inspector of Police, Aryancode was directed to take legal action if any problem is caused by any of them.

The above report, therefore, shows that an enquiry was conducted by the Police on the complaint of the petitioner and during the said enquiry it was revealed that the allegation of the petitioner is false and hence the Police did not take any further action.

In view of the above report no further orders are required on this petition and if the petitioner has any grievance regarding the enquiry conducted by the Police she has to approach the Court for the redressal of her grievance in view the judgment of the Supreme Court in 'Sakri Vasu Vs. State of U.P and Others (AIR 2008 Supreme Court 907)'.
